REPORT ON THE RESOLUTIONS FROM GROWER BUSINESS SESSION HELD JANUARY 30, 2020 76th ONTARIO PROCESSING VEGETABLE INDUSTRY CONFERENCE

GENERAL

- ResolutionWhereas the crop insurance plan is a grower based plan, BE ITCarried20-01RESOLVED that the bypass schedule in the 2019 grower
contracts, for all crops, may be adjusted for the 2020 crop contract
year to enhance grower positions.Carried
- **Report** We have asked Agricorp to conduct an analysis on the impact of any changes to the bypass program. Grower premiums may be affected should a change to the design of the program be implemented.

For 2020, no changes were made to the program.



- ResolutionBE IT RESOLVED that all payment terms and conditionsCarried20-02contained in the 2019 negotiated agreements for all crops
remain the same for the 2020 crop year, except if to enhance
grower positions.Carried
- **Report** The grower negotiation committee groups made no changes to payment terms and conditions for 2020 agreements.



TOMATO

Resolution Carried Whereas all processing tomato growers in District 1 want to have 20-03 a price for their product that will keep their products competitive with competing products that may be imported from other growing areas.

> Whereas our Ontario processors compete with each other on many products that they market.

> Therefore, be it resolved that the OPVG support the negotiator groups with information that will allow them to negotiate a fair price for the grower body that they represent.

> Further be it resolved that the individual negotiators be compelled to report to OPVG proposed agreements before they are signed with their processor.

Report OPVG continues to support growers with information and price analysis. We will further investigate legal implications for growers and what information can be shared.

> We cannot compel individuals to report to OPVG, however, growers should have the ability to seek further guidance on their agreement.



Resolution Whereas each negotiation group for tomatoes work independently 20-04 and since each agreement has an effect on all growers to keep the processors competitive within the Ontario industry.

> Therefore, be it resolved that the OPVG contact FPMC to appoint a chairperson to chair all negotiation sessions that involves the tomato agreement for that year.

Report We appreciate growers' concerns but only FPMC can appoint an observer to the process. We have expressed this concern to FPMC.
