BOARD update

OPVG Review by Farm Products Marketing Commission

OPVG had its first review in five years with the Farm Products Marketing Commission (FPMC) in October. The Board reported on its activities, promotions, Board governance, strategic planning, industry issues and COVID impacts. The Farm Products Marketing Commission stated they provide reviews for all of its boards to ensure that they are operating within the authorities delegated to them and that they are accountable to their producer members. On October 28, 2020, the Commission sat down with Ontario Processing Vegetable Growers' (OPVG) directors and staff for OPVG's board review to learn more about Ontario's processing vegetable industry and about the board's vision for the future. The Commission indicated they look forward to continuing to work closely with OPVG to maximize opportunities for growth in this important sector.

Pepper Trade Action

The United States Trade Representative (USTR) has now formally requested that the United States International Trade Commission (USITC) launch its fact-finding investigation and monitoring process for imports of bell peppers. We expect that the USITC will formally initiate these investigations imminently. USTR has expressly requested that, as part of its monitoring process, the USITC collect and analyze information relevant to launch an expedited global safeguard investigation. The USITC fact-finding investigation and monitoring process can transition into an expedited global safeguard investigation following a minimum of 90 days of import monitoring. It is that safeguard investigation that could ultimately lead to the imposition of tariffs or a quantitative restriction (such as a quota), in as early as 28 days for preliminary relief (21 days for the USITC to issue a preliminary recommendation and seven days for the U.S. President to make a decision based on that recommendation), or as early as 180 days (for a final decision). The Government of Canada will be actively monitoring this investigation alongside our bell pepper industry.

At the November OPVG Board meeting, we received the research paper from a project we commissioned, through the University of Guelph, Ridgetown campus. The study was undertaken to gather information on the processing pepper industry, explore areas where the OPVG could be of assistance to the industry and assess the interest of industry participants in having the Board provide support. The Board Chair has also discussed areas of common interest with several processing pepper growers. The Board, after assessing all the information available, has decided to continue the exemption for processing peppers from OPVG Regulations for 2021. Thus, processing pepper growers continue not to be Board members as has been the case since 2012 when significant processing of peppers within Ontario ceased. Onion Negotiations

OPVG and Cavendish have reached an agreement on Onions for 2021. Cavendish commended growers for their efforts this past season despite uncertainty regarding access to labour and challenging weather during harvest.
