

2022 BURSARY APPLICATION

The OPVG is offering 3 bursaries to provide financial support and recognition to individuals pursuing post secondary education with an interest in a career in the Ontario processing vegetable industry. The successful recipients will be selected by a committee comprised of industry officials. Two bursaries will be awarded in memory of farm leaders in the processing vegetable industry, Jim Whitson and Ken Epp, while the third award is an Industry bursary.

The **Jim Whitson Bursary valued at \$2,000** will be awarded to a student attending Ridgetown Campus in their 2nd year.

Eligibility Requirements for Jim Whitson Bursary

- Applicants must be a Canadian citizen and resident of Ontario
- Registered as a full-time student in their 2nd year of study in commercial field agriculture/horticulture at Ridgetown Campus
- Preference will be given to those applicants who have recent work experience (summer or full-time) and/or community involvement in Ontario agriculture, specifically field crop horticulture
- Must include official transcript of most recent marks; average of at least 70%
- Must include an essay describing education and career goals within the Ontario processing vegetable industry (maximum 2 pages)

The **Ken Epp Bursary valued at \$2,000** will be awarded to a student attending an eligible college or university in their 2nd, 3rd, 4th or post-graduate year of study.

Eligibility Requirements for Ken Epp Bursary

- Applicants must be a Canadian citizen and resident of Ontario
- Registered as a full-time student in their 2nd, 3rd, 4th or post-graduate year of study in commercial field agriculture/horticulture, food manufacturing, etc. that closely relates to the processing vegetable industry, at one of the following universities/colleges: University of Guelph, Trent University, Fanshawe College, Fleming College, Conestoga College, Algonquin College, Olds College, University of Saskatchewan
- Preference will be given to those applicants who have recent work experience (summer or full-time) and/or community involvement in Ontario agriculture, specifically field crop horticulture
- Must include official transcript of most recent marks; average of at least 70%
- Must include an essay describing education and career goals within the Ontario processing vegetable industry (maximum 2 pages)

The **Industry Bursary valued at \$1,000** will be awarded to a student attending an eligible college or university in a program of study that relates to the processing vegetable industry (agriculture/ horticulture/food manufacturing).

Eligibility Requirements for Industry Bursary

- Applicants must be a Canadian citizen and resident of Ontario
- Registered as a full-time student in their 2nd, 3rd, 4th or post-graduate year of study in commercial field agriculture/horticulture, food manufacturing, etc. that closely relates to the processing vegetable industry, at one of the following universities/colleges: University of Guelph, Trent University, Fanshawe College, Fleming College, Conestoga College, Algonquin College, Olds College, University of Saskatchewan
- Preference will be given to those applicants who have recent work experience (summer or full-time) and/or community involvement in Ontario agriculture, specifically field crop horticulture
- Must include official transcript of most recent marks; average of at least 70%
- Must include an essay describing education and career goals within the Ontario processing vegetable industry (maximum 2 pages)
