What can I expect to do in this role? In this role, you will:

- * Be involved in the delivery of production information to Ontario agriculture industry while being mentored by OMAFRA specialist and University of Guelph researcher.
- * Coordinate a project designed to assess the presence and impact of new and existing practices, products, technologies and programs to Ontario's agriculture sector.
- * Work on a priority project, prepare educational and awareness building tools to facilitate change.
- * Gain valuable experience working with world class extension specialists and researchers on a priority project.
- * Gain knowledge of the role of government, knowledge translation and transfer (KTT) and potential career opportunities.

How do I qualify?

Applicants should be completing their third year or normally have completed 15 credits of undergraduate studies in a relevant **OAC** degree program (students from other U of G programs will be considered based on academic fit and experience related to the positions). Students completing their second year will also be considered based on academic merit. You have a valid Ontario G2 (or higher) Driver's Licence or equivalent.

Applicants should provide a resume, unofficial transcripts, and a cover letter describing their interests and stating which particular position(s) they are applying for.
